

Literature-based Nature Programs at the Library



Schedule a 45-minute program featuring a story, coordinated interactive play, and a visit with a live or mounted animal. Staff from the Connecticut Audubon Society Center at Glastonbury will be the instructors. Programs are for families with young children.

Animals in Camouflage by Phyllis Limbacher Tildes - Guess the identities of seven animals that blend with their surroundings. Look for clues in the pictures. Visit with a spider, owl and an insect.

Are You My Mother? by P.D. Eastman - This classic story about a baby bird that falls from its nest is both adorable and entertaining. As the baby bird goes on an adventure looking for its mother there are many lessons about nature and life.

Eye Guess by Phyllis Limbacher Tildes - Uncover eight animals by using the clues to learn whose eyes are looking at you. Have a visit with a turtle, owl and mouse.

Where Did Bunny Go? by Nancy Tafuri - This is a story of friends playing hide-and-seek. Where did Bunny go? Is he lost? Did he run away? See if you can help find Bunny. Have a visit with our bunny, bird and gerbil.
