Connecticut Audubon Society's Birdcraft Museum was established in 1914 by Mabel Osgood Wright, a pioneer in the American Conservation Movement and founder of the Connecticut Audubon Society.

Recognized as a National Historic Landmark in 1993, this remarkable facility includes a small natural history museum and adjacent private songbird sanctuary, the oldest in the United States.

The 6-acre Birdcraft Sanctuary, originally planted as a refuge to attract, harbor and feed migratory and resident birds, has documented records of more than 120 species of birds.

Directions:

**From I-95:** take Exit 21. Go north on Mill Plain Rd., about 1/2 mile. At the intersection of Unquowa Road take a right. You will pass a high school and middle school on your right. After you go under the I-95 overpass, the driveway into Birdcraft will be immediately on your left.

**152-acre Sanctuary open dawn to dusk**

Connecticut Audubon Society's Center at Fairfield was constructed in 1971 and adjoins the 152-acre Roy and Margot Larsen Wildlife Sanctuary. The Larsen Sanctuary comprises woodlands, meadows, streams, marshes and ponds with raised boardwalks and bridges that allow access to the varied habitats. In addition to over 6 miles of walking trails, the *Edna Stroube Chiboucas Special Use Trail* provides a wheel chair-accessible one-mile loop through the sanctuary.

Directions:

**Merritt Pkwy/Going South:** take Exit 44, go left at light at the bottom of the ramp. Go left at the next light, under the bridge and then right onto Congress St. \* At the first stop sign, go right onto Burr St. The Center is 0.9 miles on the left.  
**Going North:** take Exit 44, at end of ramp turn right onto Congress St. Follow directions from \* above.

**From I-95:** take exit 21, Mill Plain Rd. Proceed north (Mill Plain Rd. becomes Burr St.) for approximately 4.5 miles. Center at Fairfield is on left.
