A Connecticut Audubon Center at Fairfield

2325 Burr Street, Fairfield, CT 06430 (203) 259-6305

The Center adjoins the 155-acre Larsen Sanctuary providing visitors with a complete environmental experience including seven miles of walking trails. Additional features include a one-mile special-use nature trail for wheelchairs and a Birds of Prey Compound. The Center is equipped with classrooms, a library, nature store and exhibit areas.

B Connecticut Audubon Birdcraft Museum

A National Historic Landmark, Birdcraft Museum is an intimate natural history museum that provides unique opportunities to learn about birds and other aspects of the natural world. The museum features varied nature programs, seasonal bird banding and changing natural history exhibits. The 6-acre sanctuary has an observatory, boardwalk, teaching pavilion and walking trails with handicapped access.

C Connecticut Audubon Coastal Center at Milford Point

One of the top 10 coastal birding sites in the East, the Coastal Center offers a special window onto Connecticut's greatest natural resource: Long Island Sound and its complex ecosystem. Boardwalks, observation platforms with interpretive signage and a 70-ft. observation tower offer panoramic views. Hands-on exhibits, nature programs, research and a salt marsh lab explore the natural dynamics of this unique site.

D Connecticut Audubon Center at Glastonbury

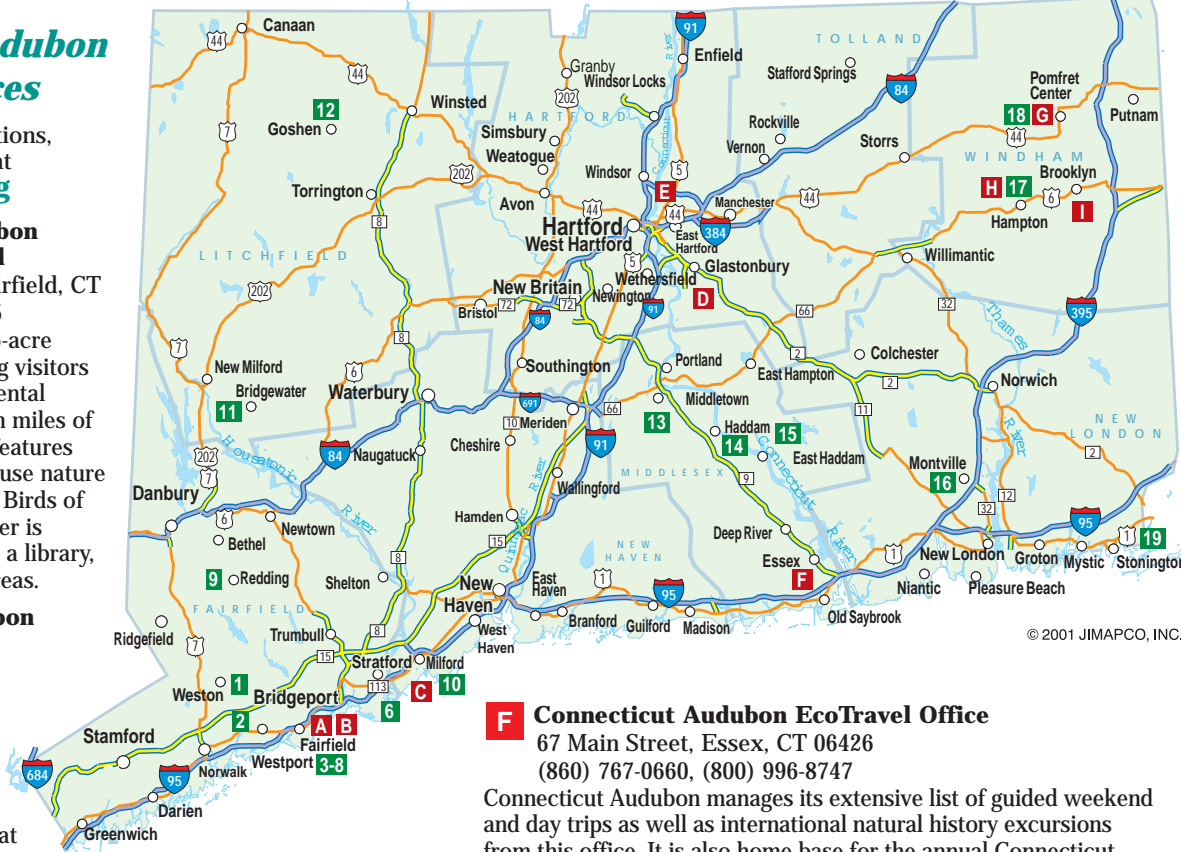

Located near the Connecticut River, the Center is adjacent to a town park with forested trails, ponds, meadows and bluffs overlooking the River. The Center offers a range of youth and adult nature-related activities including classes, workshops, lectures and special events. The Discovery Room has wildlife mounts, live small animals and hands-on exhibits providing an interactive setting for environmental learning.

Connecticut Audubon's environmental advocacy program and management of the Rolling Nature Center are housed at this administrative office located within walking distance of the state's capitol building.

Connecticut Audubon manages its extensive list of guided weekend and day trips as well as international natural history excursions from this office. It is also home base for the annual Connecticut River Eagle Festival held each February in Essex.

G Connecticut Audubon Center at Pomfret

Serving as a gateway to the adjoining 670-acre Bafflin Sanctuary, the Center serves as a community resource for environmental education and exploration of the nature wonders of rural northeast. The sanctuary has rolling hills that are maintained as a grassland habitat for many bird species. Public programs include nature walks, lectures and workshops and seasonal environmental activities.

H Connecticut Audubon at Trail Wood

The Edwin Way Teale Memorial Sanctuary

The 168-acre Trail Wood Sanctuary is the former home of Pulitzer-Prize-winning nature author Edwin Way Teale. The woodland, field, wetland and pond habitats abound with wildlife. The property offers well-developed trails and a small natural history museum with Teale memorabilia. Guided nature walks, workshops and seasonal environmental activities are offered.
