Preschool Programs Ages 4-5

Our preschool camp sessions at the Center at Fairfield offer a fun camp experience for campers ages 4 and 5. Our half-day program fosters a nurturing and supportive environment. The day begins at 9 a.m. and ends at noon. For campers who enjoy a longer day, Lunch Bunch is available from noon – 1:30 p.m. Our camps maintain a low camper-to-teacher ratio ensuring individual attention is given to each young camper while helping them to be successful within the group. Our goal is to expose campers to a variety of different experiences in an effort to create a sense of wonder and connection to the natural world.

- Campers must have turned 4 by June 1, 2015; or be entering Kindergarten in the fall.
- Campers must be toilet-trained and able to attend camp without an adult.
- Campers participating in Lunch Bunch must bring their own lunch.
- We provide a nut free snack for your child.



June 1-5 Jeepers, Creepers, What's That?

Explore the habitats at the Center at Fairfield as we learn about feathered, furry, scaly and slimy creatures. Have fun creating crafts, meeting resident live animals and searching the woodlands for signs of animals.

June 8-12 Nature Discovers Eric Carle

Explore nature using the “stars” of Eric Carle’s stories. Look for a very busy spider, a hungry caterpillar, a foolish tortoise and more. Is it true, a cricket can be quiet?

June 15-19 Fantasy Fairy Forest

Sing with the trees and dance with the dragonflies as we explore the myths and legends of the forest. Let your imagination soar as we build fairy houses, play magical games and create enchanting crafts. You’ll create your very own fairy house to take home.

June 22-26 Animal Babies

Fawns, fry, hatchlings, and kits! Deer, fish, turtle, and fox! Whose baby is whose? We’ll explore high and low throughout the sanctuary for signs of the baby animals that call the Center at Fairfield home.

June 29- July 2 Beetles to Butterflies ***4 day week***

Explore the world of insects and their invertebrate relatives. Spend time catching butterflies, ladybugs and spittlebugs in the meadow, search under logs for slugs, spiders and roly-polys and dip in the pond looking for dragonfly nymphs and diving beetles.

Junior Science Lab Grades 6-8th

This camp offers exceptional programming for campers who have completed grades 6-8. Our advance enrichment programming expands campers' knowledge with hands-on experimentation and exciting discovery. We strive to provide campers with an excellent balance of fun and engaging activities.

July 6-10 Bits and Bones: Forensic Science

This is your chance to see if you have what it takes to become the next real crime scene investigator! We'll explore the science of evidence collecting as we follow clues to solve mysteries. You'll learn about all aspects of crime scene investigation, including fingerprinting, blood splatter analysis, crime scene photography, and bullet case analysis. You'll review famous crimes to gather historical relevance. And you'll have an opportunity to test out your new investigative skills as you try to unravel a mock crime!

July 13-17 Zoology: Biology Dissection

Some biologists study plants, others study microbes, and some study fungi, like mushrooms. But if you prefer living things that move a bit faster, then zoology is for you. Zoologists study animals with and without backbones, from worms, insects, and mollusks to fish, birds, and mammals. In this program, you'll look at the whole organism and dissect its parts from the chemical makeup of its body to its cells and organs. You'll learn about whole populations of species and the ways animals adapt to their environments. And, you'll have the opportunity to dissect a frog, grasshopper, worm and starfish!

July 20-24 Fun-Omenal Physics

Calling all future mechanical engineers. Here's your chance to explore the science and design of motion and learn about concepts used to create useful devices, objects and machines. We'll investigate the principles of heat, force and the conservation of mass energy. side by side with art and design as we create our own simple machines. Guaranteed to leave you with a new perspective on how things work in the world!

July 27-31 All About the Ologies

This camp is an exploration and adventure into the ologies-Biology, ecology, ornithology, herpetology, hydrology and more! We will visit with some real "ologist," and do some hands on field excursions. While studying all the ologies we will conduct a bird count, research how many amphibian's and reptiles live on our sanctuary and much more. From birds to snakes and soil to water, we'll see what the natural world is all about.

The Coastal Center opened in 1995 and is located on an 8.5-acre Wildlife Refuge and Bird Sanctuary adjacent to the beautiful 840-acre Wheeler Salt Marsh and Long Island Sound. The Center provides easy access to tidal salt marshes, coastal dunes, tide pools, and sandy beaches, and has educational exhibits, live animals, and program activity space. For 20 years, our State-certified camp has provided unique, hands-on environmental education and outdoor adventure experiences along our shores for children. Our counselors are professional educators with CPR and first aid certifications. In the past 11 years, with the enthusiastic support of the community, we've expanded enrollment from 60 students to 291. **THANK YOU!**
